### Getting ready.....through play!

Open-ended play is a powerful way for children to learn and grow. When children engage in pretend play, their vocabulary expands naturally as they use new words to describe their ideas and stories. Playing with open-ended materials like blocks, Magna-Tiles, Duplo, bricks, and Stickle Bricks helps develop their executive functioning skills—such as planning, problem-solving, and flexible thinking, because these resources don't have a single 'right' way to be used. Self-regulation skills, like taking turns, sharing and waiting patiently, are also learned during play with others. These social moments teach children how to manage their emotions and behaviour in a supportive environment.

It's important to remember that children don't need to be 'prepared' for the next stage of their education. Their brains and bodies develop naturally through play, at their own pace. So, if a child is four, let them enjoy being four, fully engaged in play and discovery, not simply as a child preparing for school. Play is their work and their way to learn about the world.
