CHILDREN'S WORKSHOP NEWSLETTER



WHAT WE'RE LEARNING

This week we have been learning colours and shapes through play.

Rainbow room took inspiration from the artist Wassily Kandinsky, exploring his colourful artwork and talking about the different shapes we could see. Our rainbow cloud name writing activity has been a big hit! We linked our discussions about colours to recognising and writing the letters in our names, helping to build confidence in early mark-making and letter formation. During our exciting shape hunt in the shredded paper tray, everyone had great fun searching for hidden shapes and naming them as they found them. They have also been enjoying lots of colour-themed songs - especially our favourite song about the colours of the clothes we are wearing.

The sunbeams children have explored colour recognition and early science skills through colour pouring and water mixing activities. Using clear containers, they carefully poured coloured water, watching in amazement as new colours formed. Painting gave our sunbeams the chance to express themselves while exploring colour combinations. Our shape detectives were busy searching the room for circles, squares, triangles, and rectangles. During shape printing, children used shape blocks dipped in paint to create patterned artwork. This helped strengthen shape recognition while encouraging creativity and early math skills.
